

In 2014, USDA Farm Service Agency’s certified corn acres planted in Arkansas was 511,067. Arkansas planted 41% less acres in 2014 than 2013’s 862,866 acres.

The top 5 counties for corn planted acres in Arkansas were Lonoke, Arkansas, Jefferson, Craighead, and Desha. The top 5 counties planted 31% of Arkansas’ total corn acres.





Figure 3. Irrigated Corn Planted Acreage, Arkansas Counties, 2014



Over 95% of the corn acres planted in Arkansas is irrigated. The top 2 counties with the largest acres irrigated 100% of the corn planted.







Figure 6. Irrigated Sorghum Planted Acreage, Arkansas Counties, 2014











Figure 11. Irrigated Soybean Planted Acreage, Arkansas Counties, 2014



82% of the soybean planted acres in Arkansas were irrigated in 2014.











Figure 16. Irrigated Cotton Planted Acreage, Arkansas Counties, 2014



93% of Arkansas' cotton acres were irrigated in 2014.








Figure 19. Top Five Counties, Pecan Planted Acreage, Arkansas Counties, 2014




