

For 2015, USDA Farm Service Agency's certified corn acreage planted in Arkansas was 447,024. Arkansas planted 13% less acres in 2015 than 2014's 511,067 acres.

The top five counties for corn planted acreage in Arkansas were Jefferson, Lonoke, Arkansas, Desha, and Ashley. The top five counties planted one-third of Arkansas' total corn acreage.





Figure 3. Irrigated Corn Planted Acreage, Arkansas Counties, 2015



For 2015, USDA Farm Service Agency's certified sorghum planted acreage for Arkansas was 422,413. Arkansas had a 268% increase in sorghum planted acreage in 2015 compared to Arkansas' 2014 acreage of 157,575 acres.

The top five counties for sorghum planted acreage in Arkansas were Phillips, Lee, Crittenden, St. Francis, and Mississippi. The top five counties planted 58% of the Arkansas' total sorghum acreage.





Figure 6. Irrigated Sorghum Planted Acreage, Arkansas Counties, 2015











Figure 11. Irrigated Soybean Planted Acreage, Arkansas Counties, 2015



In 2015, 81% of the soybean planted acreage in Arkansas in 2015 was irrigated.











Figure 16. Irrigated Cotton Planted Acreage, Arkansas Counties, 2015



In 2015, 96% of Arkansas' cotton acres were irrigated.



Figure 17. Top Five Counties, Peanut Planted Acreage, Arkansas Counties, 2015









Figure 21. Top Five Counties, Other Vegetable Planted Acreage, Arkansas Counties, 2015
