Table 1 presents peanut acreage by NASS district. In 2013, producers planted 11,500 acres of peanuts in Arkansas. Peanut acreage was concentrated in the Delta region of Arkansas. District 3 led peanut acreage with 9,305 acres, District 6 followed with 1,803, and District 9 had 365 acres of peanuts planted.




Figure 1 presents the top 5 peanut producing counties in Arkansas. Lawrence, Randolph, and Clay counties lead the top 5 in production with 4,932, 1,848, and 1,112 acres respectively. Lee and Woodruff complete the top 5.

Table 2 presents sweet potato acreage by NASS district. In 2013, producers planted 3,560 acres of sweet potatoes in Arkansas. Sweet potato production is focused in the Delta growing region of the state of Arkansas. Districts 6 and 9 had the largest sweet potato acreage for 2013, with 2,625 and 794 acres respectively.




Figure 2 presents the top 5 sweet potato producing counties in Arkansas. Delta counties lead the top 5 in Arkansas sweet potato production, with the exception of Pulaski County. Cross (2,256), Ashley (576), and Phillips (226) Counties are the top three producing counties. Pulaski County is the only non-Delta county in the top 5, with 141 acres of sweet potato production.

Table 3 presents other vegetable acreage by NASS district. Other vegetables totaled 7,422 acres in 2013. Other vegetables include all vegetables less sweet potato acreage in Table 2. Districts 9 and 3 lead in production, with 2,418 and 1,635 acres planted respectively.




Figure 3 presents the top 5 other vegetable producing counties in Arkansas. Lincoln (959), Mississippi (957), and Jefferson (952) Counties are the leading three counties.

Table 4 presents pecan acreage by NASS district. In 2013, producers planted 6,478 acres of pecans in Arkansas. Districts 7 and 6 had the largest pecan acreage for 2013, with 4,109 and 1,166 acres respectively.




Figure 4 presents the top 5 pecan producing counties in Arkansas. Two Ouachita growing region counties lead the top 5 in Arkansas pecan production. Little River and Miller counties lead the top 5 with 2,772 and 993 acres planted, respectively. Lonoke, Jefferson, and Phillips counties completed the top 5.

Table 5 presents fruit acreage by NASS district. In 2013, producers planted 690 acres of fruit in Arkansas. Districts 1 and 4 had the largest fruit acreage for 2013, with 246 and 209 acres respectively.




